One day she was playing skipping.

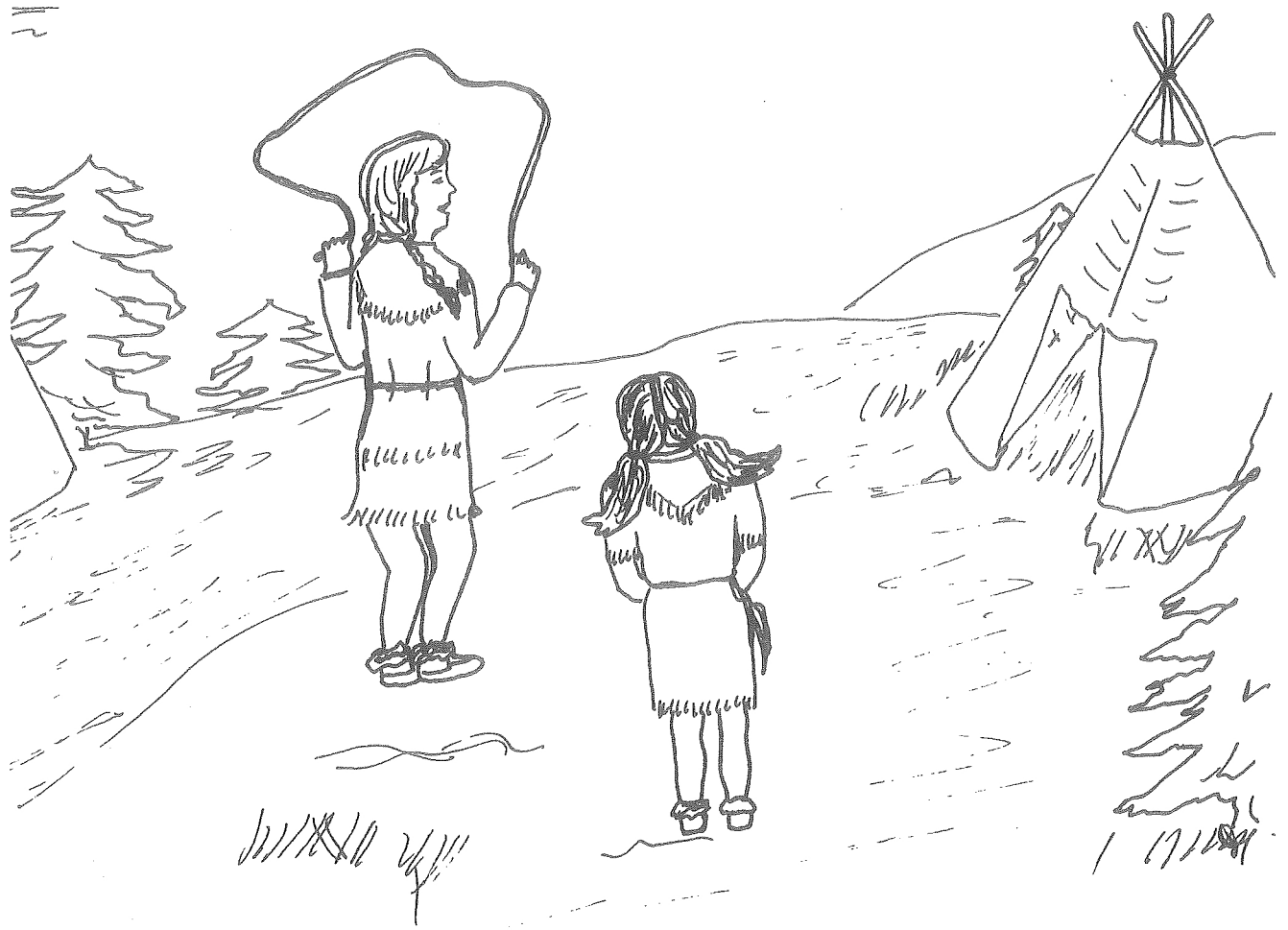
She was skipping with her

Skip. Skip. Skip.

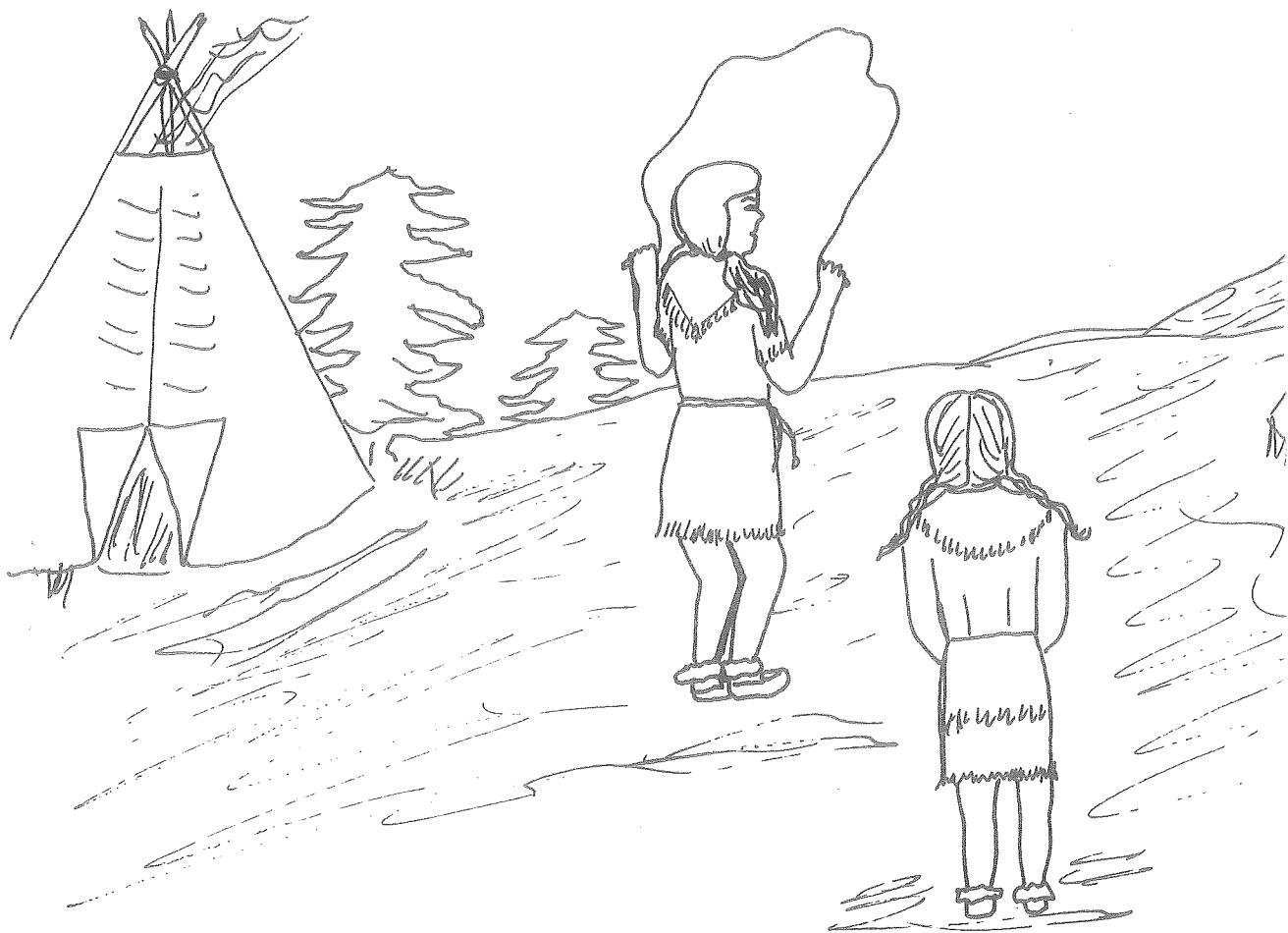
CAN I TASTE YOUR WATER?

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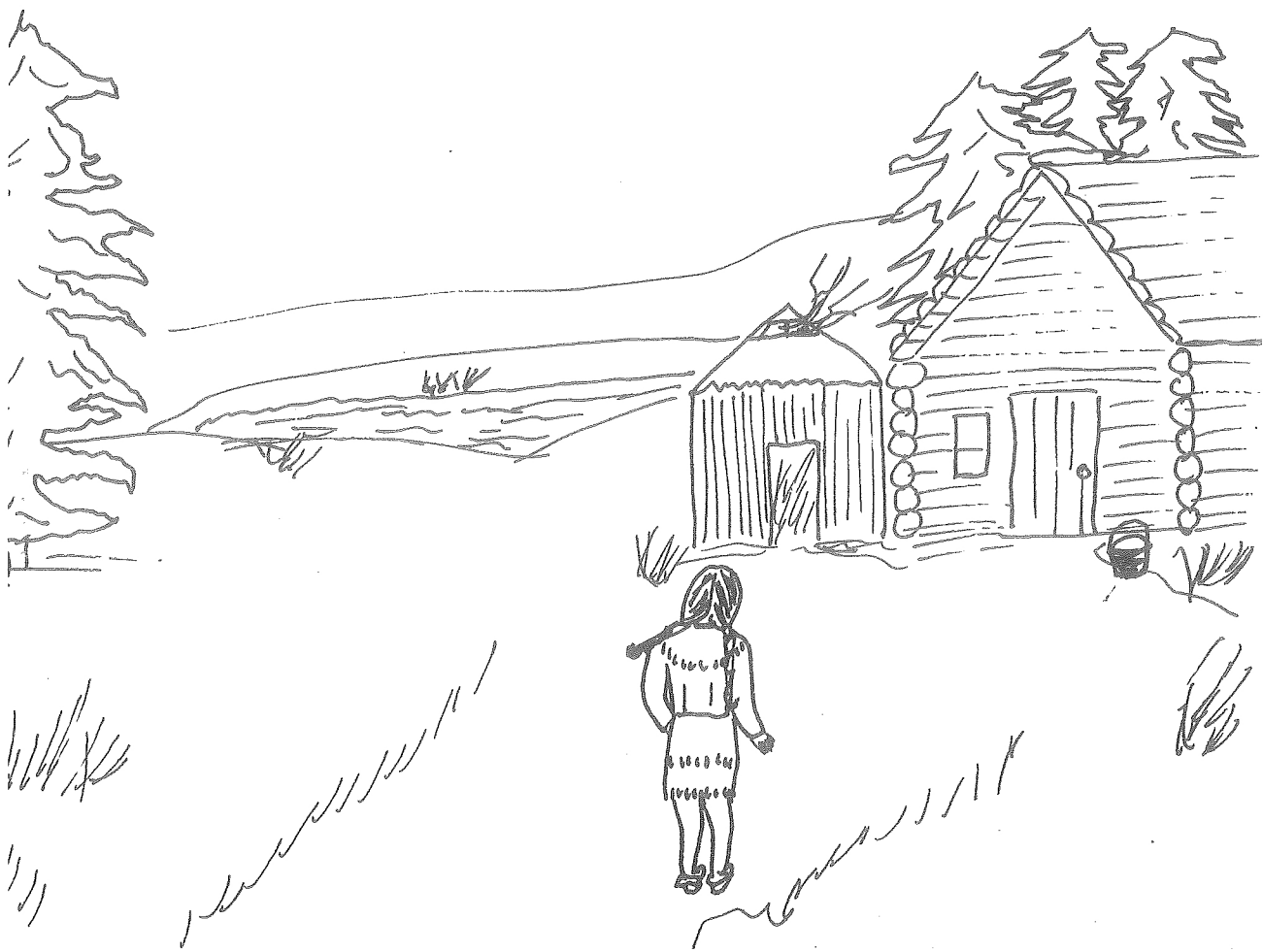


Mary skipped 100 times.
