




"Go check the net," said the wife.

Next, he took his ice chisel.


The man broke the ice.






The man took a string from his sled.

Next, he took the net off the stick.


Then, he tied the string to the net.

The net was on the ice.


He pulled out one fish.

So the son ran to the wife.







The fish fell on the man.



The dog fell on the raven.





Still more work to do!






The man pulled more fish out of the net.
