




# 10<sup>th</sup> Annual NWT Water Stewardship Strategy Implementation Workshop

NWT water partners<sup>1</sup> are invited to a one and a half-day NWT Water Stewardship Strategy (Water Strategy) Implementation Workshop at the Chief Drygeese Centre in Dettah, NT.

The workshop will bring water partners together to share our recent implementation work and discuss how we can continue to work together towards the vision of the Water Strategy.

“The waters of the Northwest Territories will remain clean, abundant and productive for all time”.

NWT Water Stewardship Strategy Vision

Under the theme of ***Northern Waters in a Changing Climate***, the workshop will focus on the intersections between climate change and water resources and foster the exchange of ideas, stories, and research findings to facilitate collaboration, relationship-building and shared learning among water partners. This theme reflects the need to work together strategically across issues of water and climate change to achieve the vision of the Water Strategy.

**Workshop Objectives:**

- Emphasize the importance of our individual and collective responsibilities to ensure *the waters of the NWT remain clean, abundant and productive for all time*.
- Increase awareness of water partners’ implementation initiatives towards water stewardship in the NWT, emphasizing those that link with climate change.
- Provide opportunities for meaningful discussion, knowledge sharing and relationship-building among water partners.
- Identify new opportunities for collaboration or partnerships towards water stewardship in the NWT.
